

POMEGRANATE

Varieties:

Pomegranates are not only a delicious fruit but also an excellent addition to your garden. We currently offer Parfianka, Salavatski and Wonderful pomegranate tree varieties.

Parfianka: red tangy fruits

Salavatski: large deep red fruits

Wonderful: largest, sharp-tart flavor

Planting Time:

The best time to plant pomegranate trees is in the fall through early spring when the weather is mild.

Site Selection:

Sunlight: Pomegranates thrive in full sunlight and require at least 6 to 8 hours of direct sun each day.

Soil: Pomegranates prefer well-drained soil and are adaptable to various soil types. Ensure proper drainage to prevent root rot.



Planting and Care

Planting: Dig a hole that is three times the size of the root ball of your pomegranate tree and plant it at the same depth it was in its container. Add compost with your native soil and water thoroughly after planting to help settle the soil.

Pruning: Pomegranate trees benefit from pruning to maintain shape and encourage fruit production. Prune during the dormant season in late winter or early spring.

Fertilizing: Apply Plant-tone organic fertilizer

Pests and Diseases: Pomegranate trees are generally resistant to pests and diseases.

Harvesting

Pomegranates typically mature in early fall. Ripe fruits will be heavy, have vibrant skin, and make a metallic sound when tapped. To harvest, gently twist the fruit from the tree.

Pomegranates can be stored for several weeks at room temperature or in the refrigerator for many weeks.
